

Situated in natural bushland at the foot of the Darling Scarp, Southern Cross Care WA's (SCCWA) Jeremiah Donovan House is committed to providing the highest level of care and support to all residents.

Beneficial design features

Jeremiah Donovan House has been specifically built with spacious corridors and rooms, including enclosed walkways between house and communal areas.

All bedrooms, bathrooms and communal areas include emergency call bells and movement sensor lighting.

Daily activity opportunities, such as entertainment, social activities and outings, are engaging for our residents and we offer aromatherapy, massage, music therapy and Pastoral Care support at no extra cost.

This modern 65-bed residential care home is 2km away from the Forrestfield Forum Shopping Centre, which has a post office, bank and chemist with easy access to a medical centre, hospital and ambulance service. It is located 2.8km from Tonkin Highway, two bus stops are located within 200m and there is onsite parking, making it convenient for family and visitors. It is also co-located with SCCWA's Donovan Village and Donovan Respite Centre.

Personalised care

Our dedicated and well-trained team support our residents 24 hours a day, seven days a week with personal care, medication management and hotel services. Residents also receive specialist support from allied health professionals. We encourage residents to use their current General Practitioner (GP), however our team can assist you to locate another GP who regularly visits.

For residents with dementia, we have weekly visits from our Dementia Services Team who assess and review residents. They work closely with family members and staff to develop a personalised support plan, to ensure the resident is comfortable and happy in their surroundings.

Common areas

An abundance of natural light is provided in common An abundance of natural light is provided in common areas via picture/bay windows in sitting rooms and glass doors. Our common areas have views to the landscaped grounds, stream, Darling Scarp as well as, internal and external courtyards. Jeremiah Donovan House has large, well-appointed dining and lounge rooms that can cater for all residents, including those with mobility aids. Our spacious rooms include furniture of high-quality fabric and style. Our common areas feature wall art, occasional tables, hall tables, display cabinets, bookcases and a fish tank.

There is a wide variety of activities for residents of Jeremiah Donovan House to enjoy, including a large screen TV with DVD player, along with a collection of DVDs. There is also a library of books for residents, as well as a piano and cards table. Tea and coffee making facilities are available for family and friends in all communal areas. The on-site chapel provides a place for quiet reflection, or residents can attend the regular mass services.



Residential aged care fees

Aged care fees depend on your financial situation, which is worked out through a means assessment of your income and assets.

Accommodation costs

This is the amount some people pay to help with or cover the full cost of their room. The amount depends on the results of the means assessment.

Basic daily fee

This is a set government fee that everyone pays for daily living expenses and services. It is the same for all individuals and does not depend on income or assets. The government updates this fee twice a year.

Non-Clinical Care Contribution (NCCC)

A means tested fee for non-clinical aged care services, such as bathing and mobility assistance this has a yearly and annual cap.*

Hotelling contribution

Means tested payment for residents with sufficient income and assets will make towards their everyday living costs and basic services.*

Payment options defined

Residents have a choice on how they wish to pay for their accommodation. Residents are required to complete a Centrelink assessment which, determines eligibility for government financial assistance for their accommodation.

- Refundable Accommodation Deposit (RAD), which is an upfront amount paid by a resident for entry into residential care.
- Daily Accommodation Payment (DAP), which is a daily payment amount.
- A combination of RAD and DAP, which is where a resident makes an upfront payment of a portion of the RAD and the remainder is paid as a DAP. For illustrative purposes, this has RAD and 50 per cent DAP.

Room types

Our well-maintained single bedrooms have their own private ensuite, electronic high/low adjustable bed and appropriate furnishings. The large mid floor-to-ceiling windows provide views of the landscaped gardens.
