



Victoria Park House

1 Croesus Street, Kalgoorlie WA

Victoria Park House caters for up to 51 residents, the home features bright and cheerful rooms, providing 24-hour care to all residents. Victoria Park House provides permanent residential care and respite accommodation.

Beneficial design features

Victoria Park House has been specifically built with comfortable rooms equipped with emergency call bells and assist rails throughout. A fully equipped dental clinic has also been recently added to the facility providing residents with state-of-the-art dental care.

The Kalgoorlie Hospital and Path West Kalgoorlie Laboratory are just over 1km away, with another medical centre nearby. Victoria Park Hostel is within 300 metres of St Mary's Catholic Church and only 1.5km from Hannan Street and the Goldfields Highway. Victoria Park House also provides aged care accommodation and short-term respite accommodation options, which makes visiting convenient for family and friends. Victoria Park House provides short term respite accommodation, from one day to a number of weeks, providing peace of mind for carers. It can also be an important step in the smooth transition of the care recipient into permanent placement.

Personalised care

Our dedicated team support our residents 24 hours a day through a with personal care, medication management and hotel-type services. We also receive specialist support from allied health professionals. We encourage residents to continue using their current General Practitioner (GP) however, our team can assist you to locate another GP who regularly visits. For residents living with dementia, we have support from our Dementia Services Team who assess and review our residents. We work closely with family members and our Care Team to develop a personalised support plan, to ensure the resident is comfortable and happy in their surroundings.

Common areas

Victoria Park House has a library and a hairdressing salon, along with a unique onsite chapel, which features a striking stained-glass mural. The chapel provides a place for quiet reflection, or residents can attend regular mass services. The adjoining lounge areas are well maintained and furnished comfortably. Residents can participate in a number of activities and we also have a large screen TV with DVD player along with a collection of DVDs. Residents can enjoy home-cooked meals prepared by our onsite chef in the lovely dining rooms. The outdoor garden area is well kept with raised garden beds, so residents can participate in gardening activities.



Residential aged care fees

Aged care fees depend on your financial situation, which is worked out through a means assessment of your income and assets.

Accommodation costs

This is the amount some people pay to help with or cover the full cost of their room. The amount depends on the results of the means assessment.

Basic daily fee

This is a set government fee that everyone pays for daily living expenses and services. It is the same for all individuals and does not depend on income or assets. The government updates this fee twice a year.

Non-Clinical Care Contribution (NCCC)

A means tested fee for non-clinical aged care services, such as bathing and mobility assistance this has a yearly and annual cap.*

Hotelling contribution

Means tested payment for residents with sufficient income and assets will make towards their everyday living costs and basic services.*

Payment options defined

Residents have a choice on how they wish to pay for their accommodation. Residents are required to complete a Centrelink assessment which, determines eligibility for government financial assistance for their accommodation.

- Refundable Accommodation Deposit (RAD), which is an upfront amount paid by a resident for entry into residential care.
- Daily Accommodation Payment (DAP), which is a daily payment amount.
- A combination of RAD and DAP, which is where a resident makes an upfront payment of a portion of the RAD and the remainder is paid as a DAP. For illustrative purposes, this has been shown in the table below as 50 per cent RAD and 50 per cent DAP.

Room types

Our bright and spacious single bedrooms are approximately 18m² size and include an ensuite and electric high/low bed. Bedrooms have individually controlled reverse cycle air conditioning. Large sliding doors provide direct access to the shared courtyard and landscaped gardens. The rooms are closely located to the communal areas and the nurses' station.

These rooms are 12-14m² in size and include an ensuite, appropriate furniture and personal storage areas. Some rooms have individually controlled reverse cycle air conditioning. All bedrooms have large windows that overlook the landscaped garden areas and are in close proximity to all the communal areas and the carers' station.
